President's Message

Happy Fall Everyone,

It has been a dynamic time in our province, marked by political and economic shifts that will undoubtedly influence our industry.

A provincial election, after some recounting in a few ridings, has resulted in a majority NDP government. While the NDP remains in office, changes within the government, including a cabinet shuffle, brings new faces and challenges. We now have a new ministry and Minister of Mining and Critical Minerals, the Honorable Jagrup Brar, who has been an MLA since 2004 but has no prior experience in this sector. Additionally, a new Deputy Minister, Nathaniel Amann-Blake, has been appointed, signaling a fresh start for this ministry.

When such changes occur, mandate letters from the Premier outline the new priorities for cabinet ministers. As an association, we are proactively working to engage with Minister Brar and Deputy Minister Amann-Blake to introduce our association, highlight our role in the industry, and offer our support. Building a successful relationship with the new leadership, as we had with the Honorable Josie Osborne, is a key focus for us moving forward.

On the economic front, the Bank of Canada's recent significant drop in interest rates is expected to boost private investor confidence. This is a positive signal for our industry, as increased investment translates to more demand for aggregates, contractors upgrading their equipment fleets, and sustained business for equipment companies.

We've also been making steady progress with our education initiative, although sometimes it feels like a slow journey. Derek and I recently completed the Ontario Stone, Sand, and Gravel Association's initial 4-hour safety program. In Ontario, it is mandatory for all new hires in the mining and aggregate sectors to complete and pass this course within 60 days of starting employment. We are excited to roll out a similar program here.

Looking ahead to 2025, we plan to introduce the Aggregates 101 and 201 courses. I had the opportunity to take both courses in Toronto this past summer and can attest to the immense value they bring to our industry. These courses cover essential topics such as permitting, crushing, washing, blasting, and more providing a comprehensive understanding of the disciplines that define our industry.



Lastly, as we approach the holiday season, I encourage everyone to mark December 5th on your calendars for our annual Christmas luncheon in Surrey. It's a wonderful opportunity to come together, celebrate our successes, and enjoy the camaraderie of our members.

Wishing you all a joyful Christmas season filled with time spent with family and friends.

GAIN Conference Report

On October 20-23rd, countries from around the globe united in Cordoba, Argentina for the 7th Global Aggregates Information Network (GAIN) conference. The GAIN meeting was held in conjunction with Argentina's National Aggregates Congress where local producers, mining associations and politicians converged on various industry topics which also included a trade show featuring new quarry equipment and technologies.

Held for the first time in South America, the conference welcomed an expanded delegation from Latin American countries with representatives from each Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Colombia and Costa Rica. Canada and the United States rounded out the Americas, while Aggregates Europe represented a conglomerate of 30 European countries. Asia recognized delegates from each China, Malaysia and South Korea, with New Zealand closing out the list of countries in attendance.



The Aggregate Producers Association of Canada (APAC) participated in the GAIN meeting, sharing industry initiatives from the various provinces along with current challenges such as access to resources,



a slowing economy, labour shortages, and the recent challenges faced with the rise in population due to record immigration levels.


The role of aggregates associations was evident throughout the meeting, particularly in convincing governments on the benefits of investing in infrastructure, and how essential aggregates are. Of note on this topic was the adding of aggregates to the Critical Minerals List in New Zealand, the first country to do so.

Sustainability was a key theme throughout the conference, with many countries presenting their plans on reducing carbon emissions, energy and water usage. Environmental Product Declarations (EPD's) were also discussed in length with countries at various stages of maturity level in terms of implementation and acceptance. Having adopted EPD's since a few years, Europe appears the most advanced, while they are growing in other parts of the world, most notably south of the border in the United States. Significant developments in technology were presented by China while all countries presented great examples of public relations, communications and environmental stewardship. Labour shortages and the difficulties in attracting new talent to the construction industry in general are sentiments and challenges faced mutually around the globe.

As 2024 comes to a close, APAC is looking to host a face-to-face meeting with delegates from each of the Canadian provinces and the respective provincial associations in early 2025. APAC is a not-for-profit organization aimed to connect aggregate producers across the country in order to support a stronger, unified, national industry that is safe, sustainable and growing, through networking, advocacy and the sharing of best practices.

3. Supporting information such as citations, media releases, media coverage, links, photographs, and support and thank-you letters.

Selection Criteria: Applications will be evaluated based on qualitative assessments of two key criteria:

- 1. The benefits to the community
- 2. The contribution made by the Producer

While individual matters are not tackled directly, they often lead the committee in search of root causes and most of all development of solutions which we can work through with government. While mandate letter have not been issued at the time of publication, we can expect much the same in terms of initiatives from this government and the natural resource ministers such as: UNDRIP implementation throughout the Ministries, *Land Act* reform and *Mineral Tenure Act* reform. You can be assured that your committee will be in front of these Ministers as soon as possible to introduce the Association, vocalize the needs of the industry to them and listen to their plans for strengthening the sector. The NDP government was elected in October and after some judicial re-counts David Eby, as Premier, swore in Members of Cabinet on November 18, 2024. Many new faces to the natural resources industries in the province were given prominent roles in the new government along with re-branding certain Ministries. The Ministry of Mines has been making efforts to increase transparency in the work they do and have recently launched two new websites for the public where applications can be viewed and commented on and another where compliance and enforcement inspections are publicly posted.

As the site is developed we are told that Orders from inspections will be available publicly.

Other initiatives for the Committee this year and

going forward are to help the Ministry decrease permitting timelines by promoting a risk based approach, implementing hard triggers for when supplemental reports are required to a Notice of Work and allowing them to make decisions for other Ministries in certain circumstances. Big asks...but that's what we do!

The Committee has also asked that we get back in front of government face-to-face, like we used to do before Covid introduced a world of video chat. We saw a great deal of benefit when we used to do this and it will be good for us to get back doing this again; especially with so many new faces in Cabinet.



The aggregate industry is highly regulated with legislation and government policy developing quickly. Our strength is in our direct line of communication with the various levels of government who consult with our association whenever changes are considered in the Ministry of Energy, Mines and Low-Carbon Innovation (EMLI) affecting mining in the province. We also engage with local governments on behalf of our members to help municipalities understand the challenges our industry faces and lobby for regulations that work for Producers.

Sustainability is not a new concept in the BCSSGA but has been re-branded to reflect how we are perceived in public and push initiatives that build a grassroots knowledge of the value of aggregates in our schools. The Sustainability Committee also manages the Deputy Minister's award that recognizes outstanding community relations by aggregate producers in the Province.

Safety and training are foundations of the aggregate industry and the Association makes sure that we

inform our members about changes to the Health Safety and Reclamation Code for Mines in BC. We have a seat at the table of the Code Review Committee to ensure that the Code works for all mines in BC, not just the large metal mines which only account for a small number of overall provincial permits. The safety committee is also dedicated to providing resources for small operators to ensure their business has the latest and most up to date information available for their safety program.

Becoming a member in the Association ensures we have the numbers and resources to stay relevant with government and non-government entities. Producers benefit by having a strong industry voice advocating for them so they can stay focused on their business and regular updates and meetings to share and learn from others. We have government representatives attend and speak at every one of our meetings. Associates benefit from the networking opportunities and meetings hosted by the BCSSGA during the year with access to key decision makers in the organization and the ability to advertise their business.


