It can't be overstated how grateful we are for the people that volunteer their time and expertise to make sure our members views are represented. We can't do it alone, it's definitely become a team effort in the last few years as the topics become more complicated. An updated version of the code will be coming this June.

Recycling and re-use of aggregates has always been a huge focus for us as an association. Our Sustainability Committee was involved in helping draft a guidance document for the Ministry in relation to importation of concrete and asphalt with the sole purpose of blending and reusing in new materials. It seems like a simple thing, but like

anything in regulation, what seems simple just isn't.

Not only does this show our commitment to recycling but also the type of relationship we have with the Ministry. While they're our regulator they're also our partner. They understand that we need to work together in order to keep our industry healthy, and that sand and gravel is the backbone of every construction project. When an infrastructure project comes along we need to be able to permit a pit in time for that project. Not 2 years after the project is complete. We constantly push for shortening permit windows for our industry. Process must be followed of course, but grounded in the realities of the industry and market. Without consistent timelines and surety of process investment in our industry simply won't happen. We all know "more" doesn't always equal "better" and that's always a fine balance to walk.

I look forward to serving the BCSSGA in the coming year and am excited to see what we can get done. If you'd like to lend a hand or reach out with suggestions I would love to hear from you.

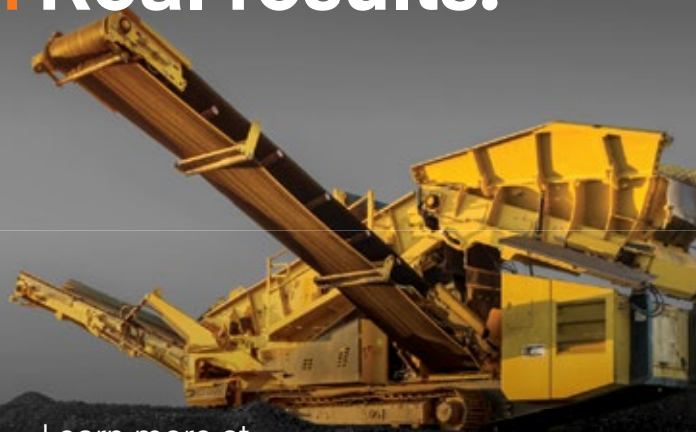

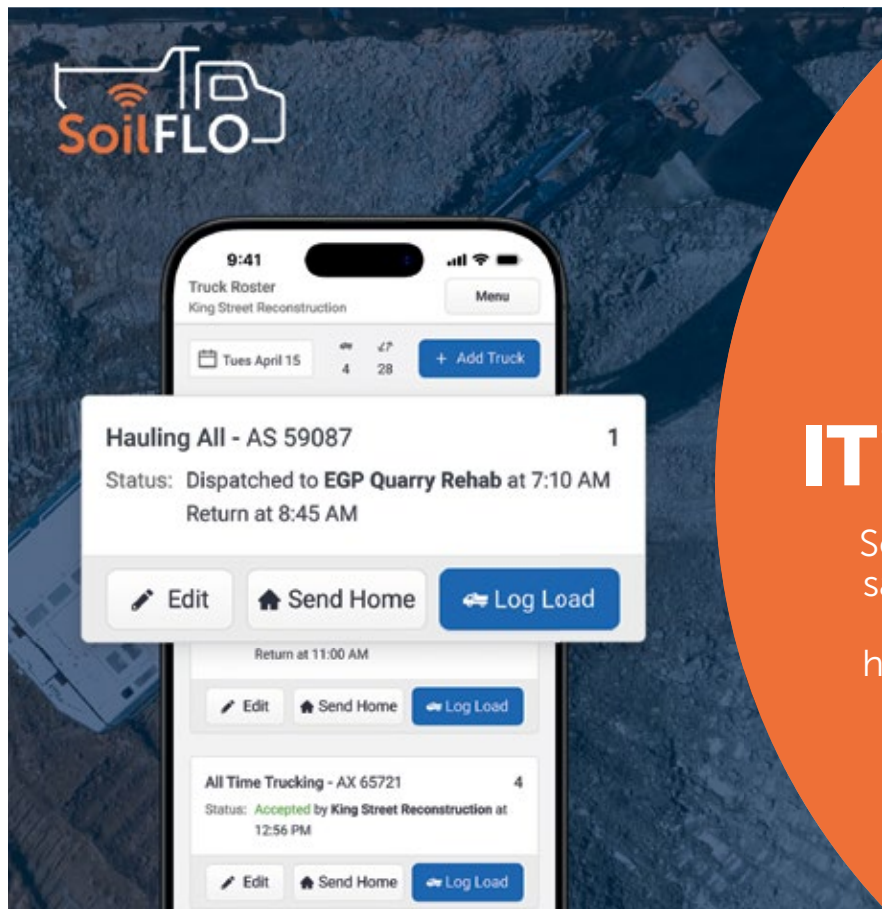

## Ministry of Mining and Critical Minerals– Herman Henning

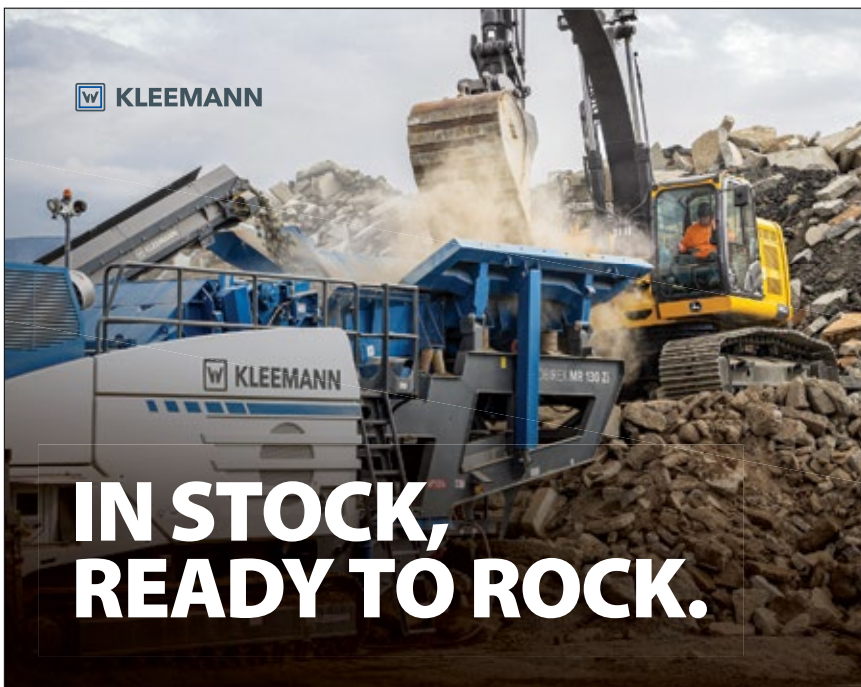
*Chief Inspector of Mines, Ministry of Mining and Critical Minerals*

## Committee Updates

### Government Relations Committee:

The Government Relations (GR) Committee is tasked with addressing the most pressing matters for membership with law-makers and regulators from the various levels of government. Along with the Safety Committee it is one of the core groups of your Association and meets both internally on a monthly basis as well as with government after every meeting. We've developed a strong working relationship with the Ministry of Mining and Critical Minerals both at a Ministerial level and, perhaps more importantly, with senior members of the bureaucracy who are more permanent than the elected ones.

We have a very focused, hard working group of volunteers on the committee from around the province who I would like to personally thank for their time. Lance Dexter, Kurt Strachan, David Rogalsky, Barry McLean, Dani Miller, Barry Chalmers, Danielle Gutwilling and Rick Kovach, thank you for your time, the early morning meetings and bringing your invaluable knowledge and insight to help move our initiatives forward. Continuing our work from 2025 we kept our focus on permitting timelines, efficiency and reducing red tape for new and existing aggregate producers.

This year, we continued our drive to reduce permitting timelines for producer members in a few key ways:

- Pushing the Ministry to fully adopt the Aggregate Application Guidance Document, co-developed with the Ministry and Inspectors;
- To look at adopting a risk matrix to focus on difficult permits and fast-track simple, low-risk ones;
- Delegated authority to the Ministry of Mining to make decisions on behalf of other Ministries and government bodies for issues like land tenuring and decisions in the Agricultural Land Reserve;

- Relying more heavily on the professional reliance model to reduce duplication of reviews if there's a coordinating professional taking responsibility for the plans; and
- Managing referrals to the major mine office and other government agencies more efficiently by ensuring Inspectors are asking and reviewing pertinent information.

Other topics we covered over the year include: the concrete and asphalt recycling guidance, organizing a tour of gravel pit on Vancouver Island, reviewing progress at Lightning Rock in Abbotsford, keeping on top of the 2025 fall job action by the Ministry of Mines employees, proposed Heritage Conservation Act changes, new ADM Kendra Johnston, Land Use Policy in the Northwest, the new FVRD soil bylaw, Land Act tenuring prioritization, Code review sub-committee work, UNDRIP implications for mining permits and lands, the natural resources forum in Prince George, illegal development permit mining, the Summerland decision, submissions on the 2027 budget, and Front Counter effectiveness. Lots of issues facing members!

As always, this is your Association so we really do need to hear from you. What is your main concern and how can we as a Committee and Association work for you? Please feel free to email us and join in the conversation.

**From the Safety Committee:**

The safety committee and the work accomplished by this group of volunteers is one of the two core functions of the Association. In addition to the many topics covered, it also functions as the liaison with government on the continuous updating and improvement of the Health, Safety and Reclamation Code for Mines in BC (the “HSRC” or “Code”). Through the work on the main Code Review Committee various sub-committees function to dive deep in to the technical aspects of the HSRC through the lens of the small aggregate producer, the fundamental group represented by the Association.

The committee got off to a slow start this year but we’ve held two meetings in 2026 and have scheduled monthly meetings going forward. We have an enthusiastic crew of committee members this year consisting of Sandra Billon, Nicole Polack, Alexandra Boyd, Nikki Keith, Jeff Adams, Mark Ellett, Paul Davenport, James Hansen, David Rogalsky and Jordan Shaw. A few of the topics we will be covering this year include:

- Truck Safety, and partnering with Safety Driven to host pop-up safety days at producing sites to promote safe driving practices;
- Electrical Safety Plans as required by the Ministry of Mines;

- Review the new Mine Emergency Response Plan guidelines (MERP) required by the Ministry and determining if the committee can prepare something for members to build from;
- Safe fuel handling guidelines (usually required in permits as a standard condition);
- Reviewing the new hard hat guidelines for construction sites and whether this could migrate to the Ministry of Mines; and
- Accepting nominations and awarding the health, safety and innovation award sponsored by FuelEx.

I’m pleased with the momentum we’ve developed over the last few months and look forward to see this committee tackle some issues that our membership feels are valuable. We are also looking for a new Chair for the committee so please let Derek or David know if you are interested in volunteering.

**From the Sustainability Committee:**

The Sustainability Committee met on April 1st, and I'm pleased to share a few updates on the work we're advancing on behalf of our members.

On the Environmental Product Declarations (EPD) front, progress is temporarily on hold while OSSGA awaits funding from the National Research Council. We'll keep members informed as that develops.

In the meantime, the committee is actively reviewing updates to Metro Vancouver's Off-Highway Equipment Emissions Regulations, and we'll be providing a summary for BCSSGA members to ensure everyone is well-prepared for what's coming.

We're also turning our attention to practical fuel efficiency, an area where small changes can make a meaningful difference. The committee is reaching out to leading equipment manufacturers, to gather industry-standard data on fuel burn rates and idle times for wheel loaders, excavators, and rock trucks. Our goal is to put useful, actionable benchmarks in the hands of our members.

Looking ahead, we're developing our action plan for 2026 and want to hear from you. If there are sustainability topics or challenges you'd like the committee to tackle, we encourage you to reach out. This committee works best when it reflects the

priorities of our BCSSGA membership.

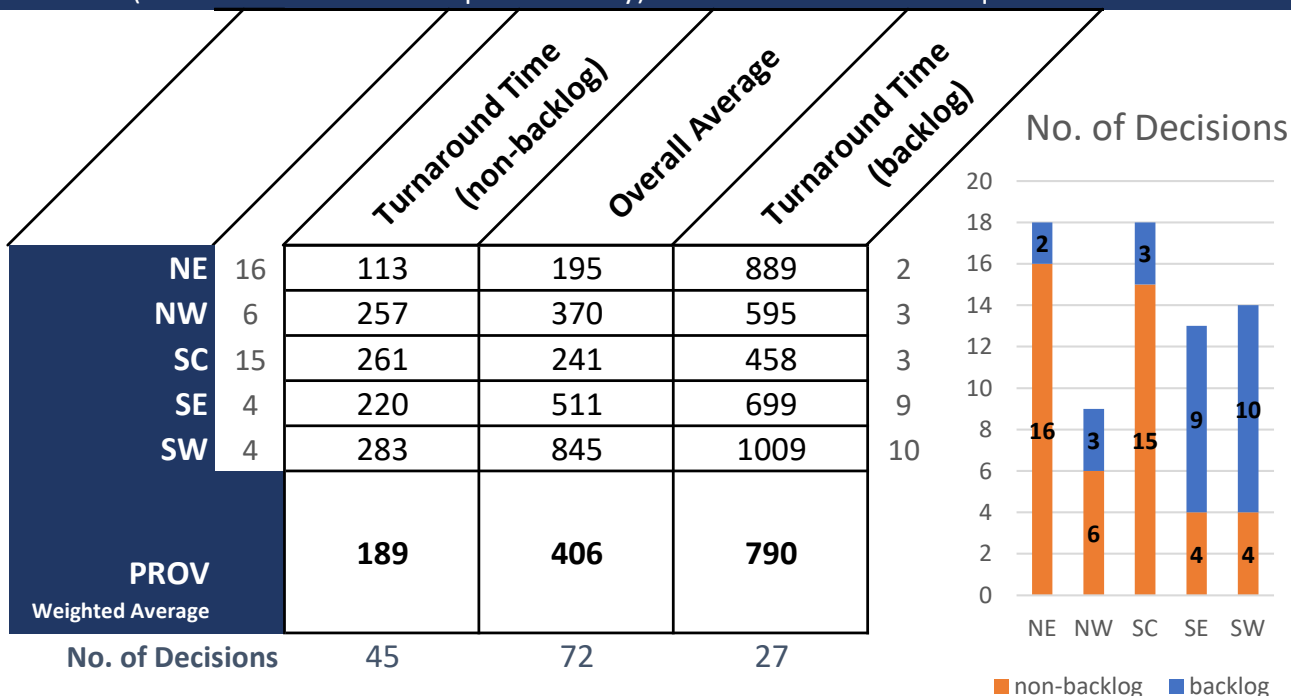

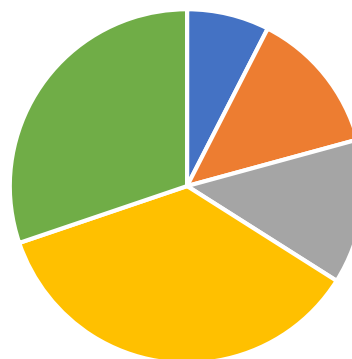

Count of Current Applications over 365 days

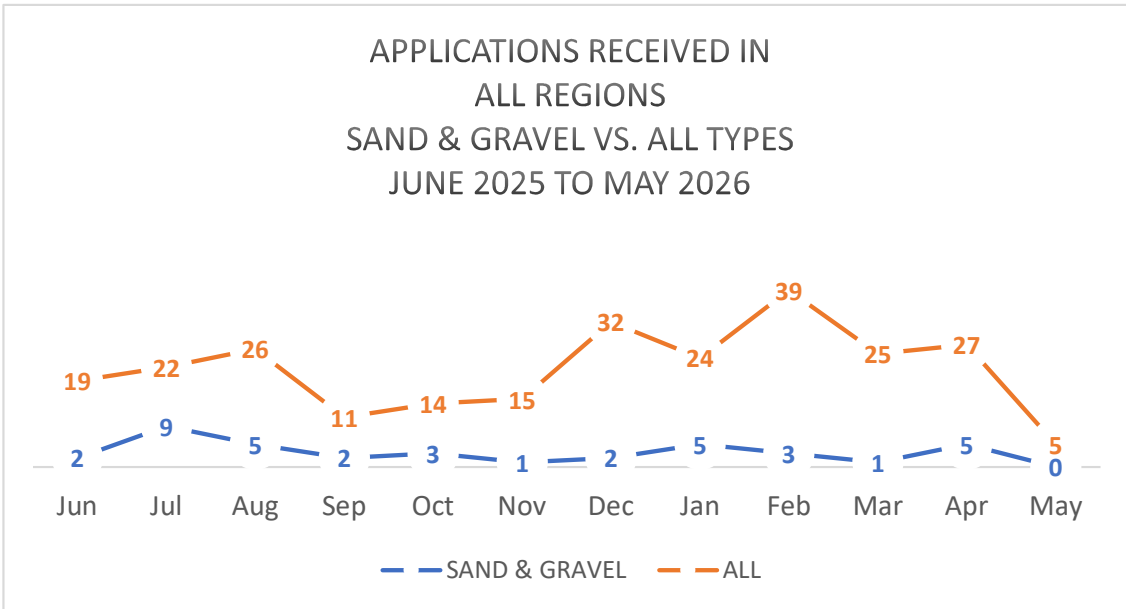
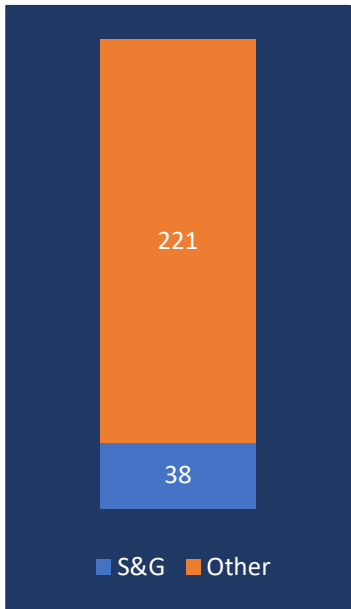

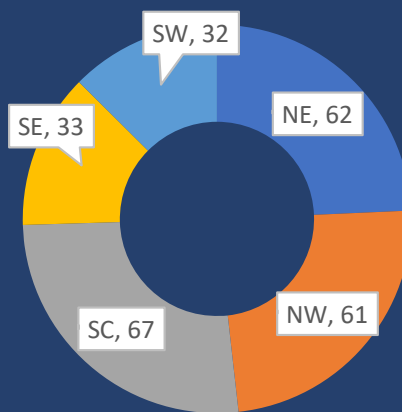

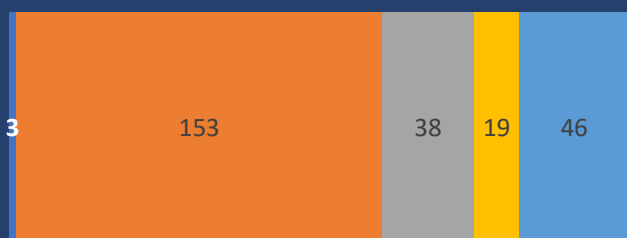

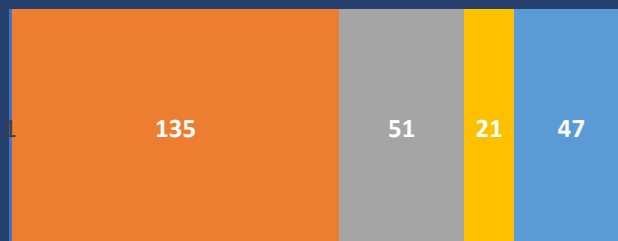
